History of Marine One Tail Number 150611

- 150611, a Sikorsky VH-3A, was delivered to the Army in 1962.
- It wore Army markings early in its service since both the Army and Marine Corps flew executive transportation helicopters.
- It was assigned to HMX-1 (Marine Helicopter Squadron One) for Presidential/executive transportation duty from 1967 to 1968, and again from 1974 to 1976.
- It also served in Navy helicopter support squadrons HC-6 and HC-2 from 1976 to 2002.
- In 1975 the VH-3A helicopters were replaced with VH-3D models, which are still in use today.
- Retired from the Navy, 150611 arrived at the Reagan Library in March of 2004.
- On loan from the National Naval Aviation Museum this helicopter has been on display inside the Air Force One Pavilion since the opening in 2005.
